This engaging workshop in The Singer's Toolkit Series is an in-person presentation and masterclass workshop with Dr. Candace Y. Johnson (DMA) featuring students and/or NATS members as performers. In a brief presentation, Dr. Johnson will share her experience incorporating inclusivity and cultural awareness teaching voice class for the last 12 years to a widely diverse body of students at UC Berkeley. She will also share resources for repertoire by black composers and talk about her journey to create her own blend of opera, gospel, and jazz. She will then work with SFBAC NATS performers to address such topics as style, cultural sensitivity, and authentic interpretation. Together, we will find a safe space to be inspired and challenged as we step out of our comfort zones to explore new ways to teach singing with diversity in mind.

Apply to Participate:

Deadline to submit an online Application to participate as a performer in this workshop is Saturday, **January 8**, **2022**, by 5:00 p.m. 5 participants will be chosen to perform in the workshop and will be notified by January 10, 2022.

Please prepare a video recording of yourself singing one selection for solo voice with accompaniment (live or recorded) and submit the link to a YouTube posting of your video below. At the beginning of your video, be sure to announce your name clearly and the title of your selection .

Preferred repertoire to present at the workshop includes the following: a classical piece by an African American composer (including Spirituals), musical theater, jazz, gospel, or a power balladballad may be sung in any language. If a student is chosen to present at the workshop, but does not have the preferred repertoire, anything from the audition repertoire list is perfectly acceptable.

Songwriting Divas of Latin America & Expanding Vocal Lifespan for Mariachi Singers


Professor of Voice/Operachi singer **Dr. Juanita Ulloa** has been selected to present a recital at NATS National Chicago Convention July 3, 2022 on **Songwriting Divas of Latin America**, alongside guest artist singers **Katya Roemer** and **Lidia Chávez**.

Additionally, Dr. Juanita Ulloa and two of her voice students José Sánchez and Lidia Chávez, will present on Expanding Vocal Lifespan for Mariachi Singers: A study of current conditions, vocal history and recommendations at the early 2022 California Western Regional Festival Competition. The presentation will be available online to all Sunday January 15th at 3pm (PST).



"Who Was Maestro Antonio Gomezanda?"

In the first half of 2022, Dr. Juanita Ulloa will be giving a webinar entitled "Who Was Maestro Antonio Gomezanda?" One of Mexico's many nationalistic composers, Antonio Gomezanda, is the author of 93+ art songs and the world's earliest known mariachi opera ca.1929. ABOUT THE COMPOSER

Antonio Gernezando (1894-1961) is one of many undeservedly obscure composers in Mexican music. Apart from being a piano peodigy, piano teacher, and music critic, he composed rementic and early twentieth-century nationalistic music in many gennes including large, small, instrumental, and vecal. Gomezando also wrete over 90 original sengs, several vocal deamatic works, and opera ranchera (mariachi opera) full screes discovered by Dr. Ullea in 2009. The composer continued the stylistic path of nationalism advacated by his teacher, Manuel Pance, also known as the "Father of Mexican Song." Gomezanda's nationalistic topics are often based upon elements from the Maxican falk ranchera musical style that he grew up with in Lagos de Moreno, Jalisco, Mexica along with costumbrismo literary topics. He was primarily trained in classical music in Mexica City and falter in Berlin.

Most songs in these collections are published for the first time. These publications contain International Phonetic Alphabet transcriptions (IPA) for easy Spanish pronunciation with both literal and poetic translations to English. Each song is presented with two key choices.
