#### **Deadlines:**

Teachers complete all registrations; singers/parents do not register themselves.

Online registration is open from Saturday, September 10, 2022, at 12:01 am through Saturday, October 8, 2022, at 11:59 pm.

Hello Cal-Western Region Teachers!

I hope your fall is off to a great start. On **October 6**, we will open registration for the **2023 Cal-Western NATS Regional Conference and Auditions**. These are our first hybrid auditions, with the first round being held virtually. The semi-finals and finals will take place **in person on January 14 and 15**, **2023** at the 2023 Cal-Western Regional Conference at **California State University, Long Beach**. All places and prizes will be awarded after the finals on January 15.

Registration will be through the <u>nats.org</u> site and AuditionWare. For help with AuditionWare and technical questions, please contact Justin Plank at <u>jplank.nats@gmail.com</u>

**Registration and Fees:** Registration is for the entire audition process. There is one fee for the auditions, which includes all 3 rounds. Semi-finalists/finalists will either bring their own pianist or hire one from a list provided by NATS. More information will be provided when the semi-finalists are announced.

\*\*\* Registering for the preliminary auditions implies that the student is willing to participate in **all rounds** of the auditions, and that the teacher is willing to judge in all rounds of the auditions. All teachers with participating students must judge or provide a substitute judge, no exceptions. All teachers should expect to judge full categories, regardless of the number of students entered. If you are entering more than fifteen students, you will need to provide an extra judge. Judging will be due December 5.

The hard deadline for registration is **November 7**. We will be adhering to the following soft district deadlines to try to avoid overloading the AuditionWare system. They are as follows:

Nevada District Deadline: 11-2-22 Utah District Deadline: 11-3-22 Arizona District Deadline: 11-4-22 Northern California District Deadline: 11-5-22 Southern California Deadline: 11-6-22 Hawaii District: 11-7-22 **Categories/Repertoire:** Please look carefully at the category requirements and numbering, as they may differ from your chapter requirements. Also, please note that at the regional level, all high school Musical Theater and Classical categories require three pieces. If you have any doubt about whether a selection meets the category requirements, please contact me before registering. \*Because this has been a consistent source of confusion, please note that the category time limits are designed for in-person competitions. Judges reserve the right to stop listening after the time limit is reached in video auditions as well, and that should be taken into consideration in repertoire selection. However, teachers and students should not cut their selections to accommodate the time limits; this will result in students having to sing for comments only.

<u>Video rules:</u> Please read these rules carefully, and make sure that all videos are marked Unlisted and follow the title instructions. While we're still permitting recorded piano accompaniment in the YouTube round, only Commercial Music (CM) students are permitted to use instrumental tracks. Also, only CM students may use amplification. No videos should be edited or include panning or multiple camera angles.

After the preliminary round judging is completed on December 5, seven semifinalists will be announced in alphabetical order in each category. These students will perform a full audition in the semi-finals on January 14 at Cal State Long Beach. The top three in each category will sing one selection in the finals on January 15.

Thank you all for all you do for our students and the NATS community. I'm really looking forward to hearing all of the wonderful talent in our Region!

## Dr. Juanita Ulloa National NATS presentation in Chicago, 2022

On July 4th weekend three of our chapter NATS members celebrated with a presentation on Latin American Song Goddesses at the NATS Voice Convention in Chicago. They are **Katya Roemer**, **Dr. Juanita Ulloa**, and one of our newest 27year-old chapter members, **Lidia Chávez**.

Lidia was a 2021/2022 winner in her category in NATS chapter and Cal/West Regional Competitions. All were grateful for SFBAC chapter members who attended in support.

Juanita, a specialist is Latin American and Spanish Vocal Music, covered women from Mexico, Cuba, Peru, Argentina, and Chile. She introduced songs and histories of women whose songs are traditionally performed in both classical and folkloric traditions. She sang some songs live at the piano and others pre-recorded with accompaniment ranging from solo classical harp or mariachi to Euterpe, flamenco fusion quartet. Katya sang two songs from Mexico and Cuba to the accompaniment of Bay Area pianist, Cesar Cancino. Lidia's two songs featured opposite ranges: high coloratura in Peruvian "Música criolla" style from Lima, Peru, to the darker middle range Mexican bolero.

This convention was the first to feature several presentations on Mexican and Latin American topics, a welcome change. Juanita will expand her teachings at Laney Community College in Spring semester of 2023 to include an online course in Latin American Vocal Music. Tution is free at Laney!

# **IN MEMORIAM**

We are very sad to share the news that our longtime SFBAC NATS member, **Rachel Kessler**, passed away on September 5, 2022. She was a longstanding member of our chapter and will be greatly missed.

She taught choir in the Davis schools from 1970 until her retirement in 2001. Kessler came to Davis in 1967 when her husband, Don Kessler, took a faculty position at UC Davis. She immediately became a choir director at Davis Community Church. Her first teaching assignment in Davis schools was as a one-year replacement for Davis High School music director, Dick Brunelle, from 1970-71 when Brunelle took off for a year to finish his masters degree at S.F. State. Following his return, she continued with teaching assignments at Holmes and Emerson Junior High Schools. Kessler founded the Davis Chorale in 1978 and passed on directing duties to Allison Skinner when she



retired from the group in 2010. She also founded the Davis Children's Chorale in 1995 and retired as director from that group in 2012. She continued to give voice lessons up until recently.

## I.D.E.A. Best Practices Guide

NATS takes the equitable treatment for all within our organization very seriously. Equitable treatment involves learning about I.D.E.A.: Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Anti-Racism. You may find NATS I.D.E.A. Best Practices Guide here:

This guide will help all NATS members gain a greater understanding of diversity in order to encourage enhanced awareness of inclusive practices for all identities.

#### INCLUSION

At the core of *inclusion* is diversity. Inclusion means that all members feel as if they genuinely belong - that they are valued and relied upon, empowered, and ultimately matter. Like diversity, inclusion is an outcome and often the actual experience of NATS membership, an experience that holds real potential or implications of equity.

#### DIVERSITY

The term *diversity* can be understood as: the presence of difference. It's that simple. Diversity can refer to people of various races, genders, socioeconomic status, sexual orientation, religions, ethnicity, national origins, citizenship status, and mental or physical abilities. When applied to NATS, defining diversity should also include diversity of ideas and cultural diversity. EQUITY

*Equity* is the norms, fundamentals, and policies in place that ensure everyone has access to the same opportunities.

#### ANTI-RACISM

Anti-racism is the active process of identifying, challenging, and changing the values, structures and behaviors that perpetuate individual and systemic racism. It does so by examining the power imbalances between racialized and non-racialized or differently racialized peoples.

#### SFBAC NATS DIVERSITY and INCLUSION COMMITTEE

On June 7, 2020, at our Annual General Meeting, our board presented a statement, a pledge, that our chapter will do everything in its power to condemn and reject systemic racism and anti-blackness at every turn possible, as well as encourage, seek, and welcome more Black, POC and LGBTQ+ voice teachers to our chapter, including other marginalized voices in our community. From this call to action, a Diversity and Inclusion Committee was formed, chaired by Dr. Phillip Harris and **Dr. Juanita Ulloa** along with many other members of our board and membership. Immediate action is currently being taken to work on implementing our pledge.

## **NEWSLETTER EDITOR'S NOTE**


Dear Fellow Singing Teachers,
